Why has all of this hate erupted?

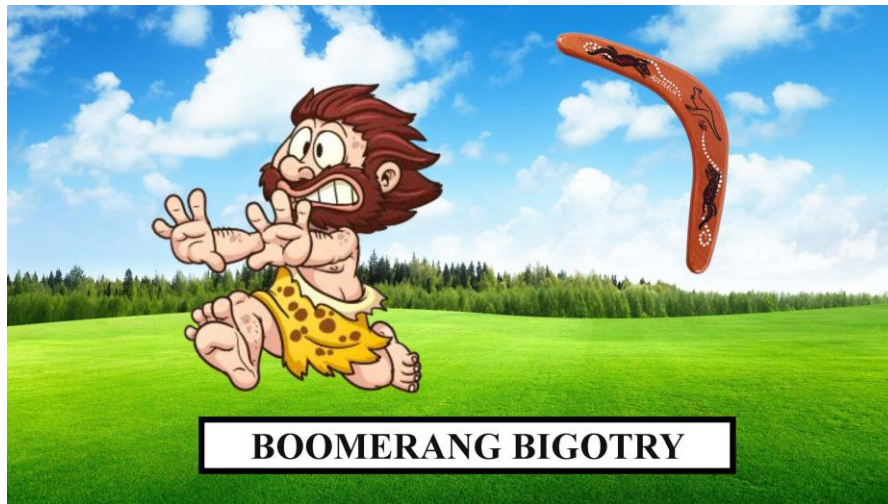
According to CNN's Van Jones, it is WHITELASH, which is the far right's response to equal rights, the election of President Obama and so on. .



This phenomenon is called "competitive victimization." Competitive victimization occurs when one group feels that it has been treated unfairly, or

illegally, so they feel perfectly justified in striking back at the group, or against some of the individuals of that group, who just wronged them. Of course, once the other side suffers the blow from the other group, they will feel fully justified in hitting back, but this time stronger. Again, it is exactly like hitting that inflatable punching bag that many of us had as kids. The harder you hit it, the harder it comes back.

I call this the “boomerang bigotry.”
